

Considering the vast impact of tax expenditures across sectors plus the various interested actors, there is a need for greater involvement and collaboration towards ensuring the effective monitoring or reporting of the cost and benefits associated with tax expenditures. TAX GLOSSARY



Aggressive tax planning (ATP)

Aggressive tax planning is the practice of taxpayers reducing their tax liability through arrangements that may be legal but are in contradiction with the intent of the law. Aggressive tax planning includes exploiting loopholes in a tax system and mismatches between tax systems to pay as little tax as possible. It may also lead to double non-taxation or double deductions.

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
